## COMPOSER FEATURE

Venetian-born composer **Benedetto Marcello** ((1686-1739) led a dual career as a well-known aristocratic politician and a noted composer of Italian church music. In his masterpiece, *Estro poetico armónico*, a setting of the first fifty Psalms (for voices, figured bass and instrumental soloists), he drew upon contemporary Jewish religious music for inspiration. He also set eleven Hebrew melodies from the Italian-Ashkenazi (Tedesco) tradition that he believed were derived from the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. These melodies are among the earliest notations of Jewish music in existence. This gorgeous melody for *Ma'oz Tzur* (a piyyut written in the 12<sup>th</sup> century) is still sung by Tedesco Jews, as well as by Jews throughout the world.
