We gather to mark these Yamim Nora'im, Days of Awe, as one community seeking to bring more peace to our souls as we navigate an uncertain world. Together, we bring life to ancient words and music that brought comfort to previous generations in good times and bad—whether these prayers are new to you or you can recite them from memory, whether you are physically present in the sanctuary in New York or spiritually present on our livestream, you are part of this community. Welcome. Congregation Beit Simchat Torah is an LGBTQS+ synagogue for people of all sexual orientations and gender expressions. We are a community of seekers. We don't hide or deny any part of ourselves. We take pride in all that makes us who we are. We strive to create a kehillah kedoshah, a sacred community, built on the pillars of prayer, study and social justice. We do not believe in a single path toward spiritual wholeness; we are a community in which personal journeys are respected. We strive to be kind and generous while being cautious and vigilant about staying healthy and keeping others safe in this time of plagues. We live with the tension and creativity of diversity, open to voices different than our own, listening to the voices of our tradition, ancient and contemporary, listening to voices of challenge. In Psalm 118 we read, "*Even ma'asu habonim haitah l'rosh pinah*. The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone."

The Jewish people have proven again and again that persecution, fear, and hatred do not define a human being or a people. At CBST, as the LGBTQ synagogue we take that lesson to heart. We refuse to be defined by those who reject us. We will continue being a powerful spiritual community of resistance and love. Our souls reach to the heavens.

I am so deeply aware that this will be my 32nd year leading our community through the profound Days of Awe. It will also be my final year in this role as Senior Rabbi. The feelings are big, and we enter these days of prayers and reflection with that layered on top of the work we do each year. There will be time in the spring to celebrate and reflect on those 32 years. Now it is our work to move through these days, carrying all the truth inside of us, with all the focus and intention the season demands of us.

**You may be familiar with the Hebrew greeting "b'ruchim haba'im", which literally means "blessed are those who arrive," and more commonly is used to mean "welcome." But Hebrew is a very gendered language, and b'ruchim haba'im is masculine plural. There are several projects to "queerify" Hebrew and to play with gender and non-binary Hebrew. It's a very exciting linguistic moment. This is one attempt that is being used now in the LGBTQ+ Hebrew speaking world. It includes both the masculine and feminine endings and rejects a simple gendered binary. Whoever you are, you are blessed and you are welcome.*

As we begin...

Cell phones and other electronic devices should be silenced during services.

Photography/videography/audio recording of services are not permitted; our services are livestreamed and archived.

Accessibility: We have designated areas for open captioning and wheelchair accessibility.

Masonic Hall: accessible single stalls are on the Second Floor.

Jacob Javits Convention Center: accessible restrooms are in the River Pavilion.

CBST on 30th Street: restrooms are accessible and available on every floor.

All-Gender Restrooms: Restrooms are available for people of all genders. Restrooms and other gender/sex-specific facilities are often places where LGBTQ+ people face harassment and violence. Commenting on gender expression, body parts, or choice of restroom is disrespectful and creates unsafe space.

Masonic Hall: all-gender single stalls are on the Second Floor.

Jacob Javits Convention Center: all-gender restrooms are in the River Pavilion.

CBST on 30th Street: all-gender restrooms are available on every floor.

For those who prefer, we have a mask-required section of the sanctuary space.
