Green Burials – What they Entail

- Jewish tradition is the original Green & Natural Burial
- No chemicals used for cleaning or preservation of remains
- Options for simple, unfinished boxes (pine, whicker, bamboo, shrouds) that are devoid of metal hinges and locks, stains, varnishes, paints and seals
- No outer interment receptacles or grave liners of steel or concrete to line a grave before placing the remains
- Nothing interrupts the return of the remains to the earth
- Everything entering the ground is fully biodegradable
- Cemetery stones are unpolished and roughly cut
- No fertilizers or chemicals used to treat grounds of cemetery for maintaining grass appearance
- Cremation utilizes fossil fuels to breakdown the body but damages the environment by the vaporization of CO₂
- This approach follows through on returning to the earth naturally, some may say even recycling ourselves properly



Reform Chevrah

- Conceived by Plaza Jewish Community Chapel, Temple Shaaray Tefila, Beth Elohim and seminarians from HUC-JIR
- Launched March 2023
- Follows Jewish tradition but performed by an egalitarian group of Jewish members
- Will comfortably provide services to the LGBTQ and/or secular Jewish community
