CBST seeks a dynamic teacher and song leader to generate *ruach*, spirit, to co-lead kids' tefillah and music, and to engage with our community of families with young children aged 0-12.

Limmud B'Shabbat is CBST's educational program for children and their families. These programs are informed by our deep *yiddishkeit*, our profound commitment to social justice, and our belief that celebrating the diversity of sexual orientation, gender identity, and family structure is an essential element of our Jewish identity and community.

- Co-lead kids' tefillah and music during bi-monthly Limmud Shabbat sessions.
- Assist teachers of the kindergarten/1st grade class, providing educational support and fostering a positive learning environment.
- Lead the <u>Alef-Bet Shabbat Program</u>, creating and implementing engaging and creative activities connected to our Limmud curriculum.
- Foster a welcoming and inclusive environment for all families and children.
- Participate in family programs for Sukkot, Simchat Torah, Chanukah, and Pride.
- Engage with the community as an attendee of our annual congregational retreat.

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills.
- Commitment to CBST's values of social justice and radical welcoming.
- Ability to play an instrument and knowledge of Jewish folk and contemporary music are a plus.
