- Check in with your trusted news organizations often.
- Take time to think critically about what you hear.
- Learn about the issues and their impact on you.
- Be aware of how wedge issues are used to divide us.
- Be prepared to share what you know with others.

Social Media

Social media is a great place to share your views and discuss issues with others. It is also a great place to find like-minded people, network, and organize. Remember to be wary of and not feed the trolls who may try to interfere with your use of social media.

Forums and Rallies

Forums and Rallies are great places to learn about and support candidates. Local not-for-profits like the League of Women Voters or local political organizations and clubs often sponsor these. Check your search engine for organizations in your area and their Websites to learn about opportunities to attend and engage.

Donate

It is said that money is the mother's milk of politics. Donating any amount is important to a campaign. One can donate in-kind goods and services as well. One way to do this is to post a campaign sign in your store window or yard. Another is to donate services such as legalor catering services.
