Cantor Ze'evi Tovlev (born 1992) became one of the first transgender cantors upon their ordination in May 2023. Ze'evi is most known for their pioneering work in nonbinary liturgy, expanding the ways we describe the genders of both human beings and God in prayer. A native of Newton, Massachusetts, Ze'evi grew up at Temple Shalom of Newton and at URJ Eisner Camp. They hold a BA in Music from Bennington College, a Masters of Jewish Education from HUC-JIR's RHSOE, and a Masters of Sacred Music from HUC-JIR's DFFSM. Ze'evi served as CBST's Cantorial Student for two years and now serves as Cantor at Temple Shalom in Chevy Chase, Maryland.
