COMPOSER FEATURE

Sergiu Natra (1924-2021) was born in Romania. He began music and piano studies at the age of 8, and graduated from the Music Academy of Bucharest in 1953. His orchestral work, March and Coral, and Divertimento in Ancient Style, earned him the EnescuComposition Prize. During the horrors of the Nazis and its aftermath, Natra and his family suffered forced labor, prison time and confiscation of all of their property, including a number of the composer's works. Finally, in 1961 they emigrated, and a year later, the Israel Philharmonic performed Natra's Symphony No.2 for string orchestra. Between 1975-1985 Natra lectured as a professor at the Academy of Music in Tel Aviv and over the years has nurtured generations of students.
