COMPOSER FEATURE

Naomi Shemer (1930-2004), known commonly as the “First Lady of Israeli Song” is most famous for her song “Yerushalayim shel Zahav” (Jerusalem of Gold). Written in 1967 for the Israel Song Festival, the song became an instant hit and was even known commonly as Israel’s “second national anthem.” Her other major hit was written after the Yom Kippur War, “Lu Y’hi” (Let it Be), modeled after the Beatles’ song by that name. For her immense contribution to Israeli music, Shemer was awarded the Israel prize in 1983.
