CBST Welcomes Guest Speakers Mason Bates and Gene Scheer

Composer of the Grammy-winning opera The (R)evolution of Steve Jobs, **Mason Bates** (he/him) is imaginatively transforming the way classical music is created and experienced as a composer, DJ, and curator. Bates has become a visible advocate for the modern orchestra and imaginatively integrates it into contemporary culture. Bates was the first Composer-in-Residence appointed by the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Named as the most-performed composer of his generation in a recent survey of American music, Bates has also composed for feature films and Philharmonia Fantastique, the soundtrack of which was awarded a 2022 Grammy Award. Bates currently serves as Artist-in-Residence at San Francisco's iconic Grace Cathedral. His new opera is, The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier and Clay.

Gene Scheer is an acclaimed American librettist and composer. He has written the libretti for 12 major operas, forging high-profile collaborations with leading composers. His Cold Mountain, premiered at Santa Fe Opera in 2015, won the International Opera Award for Best World Premiere and earned a Grammy nomination. This year marks a milestone in his career: Moby-Dick premiered at the Metropolitan Opera in March to acclaim, and the Met will launch its 2025–26 season with the world premiere of The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier & Clay. Also an accomplished composer, Scheer has written songs for renowned singers; his "American Anthem," memorably performed by Norah Jones, was featured in Ken Burns' Emmy-winning PBS documentary The War.
