
COMPOSER FEATURE

Aminadav Aloni (1928-1999) was born in Tel Aviv, the son of pioneers who had made their way on foot and horseback to Palestine from Eastern Europe. He studied piano and composition at the Haifa Institute of Music, and later at Juilliard and NYU. After a successful career as a jazz, theatre, and classical musician, he began writing Jewish music in earnest in 1977. He received numerous commissions for works on Jewish themes, ranging from Chasidic, Sephardic, and jazz services to song cycles, choral music and symphonies. Mr. Aloni made his permanent residence in the Los Angeles area, where he held the post of Music Director of Temple Valley Beth Shalom in Encino until his death. He also composed extensively for television, film, and theater.
