COMPOSER FEATURE

Nurit Hirsch (born 1942), is an acclaimed Israeli composer, arranger, and conductor. Renowned for her prolific career, she's crafted over a thousand Hebrew songs, including her beloved "Oseh Shalom," (composed for the Hasidic Song Festival) now pervasive in Jewish communities worldwide. Hirsch's musical journey began at the Academy of Music in Tel Aviv, later composing iconic pieces like "Bashanah Haba'ah" and the 1978 Eurovision winner, "A-Ba-Ni-Bi." Her contributions have earned her prestigious awards, including the Israel Prize in 2016.
