COMPOSER FEATURE

Max Janowski (1912-1991) was born in Berlin into a musical family. His mother, Miriam, was a noted opera singer and his father, Chayim, was a businessman, who also conducted several choirs and trained cantors. Max studied at the Schwarenka Conservatory in Berlin and had an impressive career as a pianist and conductor. He is one of a handful of émigré liturgical composers who came to the United States following the electoral victory of the National Socialist regime in Germany and the subsequent Anschluss in Austria. He became musical director of KAM Isaiah Israel Congregation in 1938, a post he held for more than fifty years. As a composer, he is most famous for writing Avinu Malkenu and Sim Shalom, but his over five hundred compositions, which include choral and orchestra pieces, cantatas, and oratorios in addition to liturgical compositions, have become staples in the repertoire of synagogues throughout the world.
